To the Kitsap County Public Health Board,

I participated during your last meeting where nurse Lindsey Camarena shared her experience. I have five children and 4 are in schools in North Kitsap. We have family who recently had COVID exposure and all four got sick. The unvaccinated adult very sick, their vaccinated spouse with a breakthrough case but much less sick and both children with it too, causing close contact exposures at school. They caught it in an unmasked environment with unvaccinated friends.

I am so grateful the school district was able to get the COVID tracker up for families to access last week. It appears that schools where kids are masking and the majority of adults are vaccinated and are masked the spread is being contained.

I say all this because we still don't know entirely how being in person in our schools will fully impact students, but as more and more are "close contacts" in school it is concerning. We do know that it seems people are encountering it and spreading it in unmasked environments and at a higher rate when unvaccinated. These choices impact kids. If my child lives in a cautious house taking many and all precautions but is a close contact at school, per district guidelines, they have to quarantine at home for 14 days missing potentially upwards of 10 days of school even if they do not eventually have symptoms or get COVID. They do not have a way to provide instruction for these students as teachers in NKSD have it in their union contract that they cannot be required to teach in person and online simultaneously. So unless an entire class or school is sent home due to an outbreak kids who have to quarantine are not receiving instruction.

We need to help our schools, our families who have limited resources to stay home with quarantining kids, and the community at large to keep down community spread. Folks who are not cautious directly impact those who are. To implement required vaccinations for employees, to require proof of vaccination in businesses through an order will mitigate this spread.

Please take these steps for all the reasons above and for all the reasons so clearly articulated by Lindsey Camarena at the last meeting. The doctors and nurses I know are exhausted, they are at their limits, beds are full. Our numbers are high! So many are sick and too many have died.

Additionally if there is a way to clearly and succinctly provide people with information (social media would be the most accessible) about when to quarantine, for how long, especially in relationship to our public schools we need this information more accessible. Partner with the schools districts, ask them to be more communicative about what it means to be a close contact and what that requires. What should folks do if and when their children are exposed outside of school but attend public school? Connect them to testing. What is the criteria being used to decipher if the cases are stemming from in school exposure or community exposure? What questions should we be prepared to answer to the county or school if we are positive or are exposed? What is required for children to return to their classroom? What info should we be providing about exposure, positive tests to the schools? We need more information and the Public Health District partnering with the schools will pool the resources and put on the pressure because we do not have this

important information. In many cases I know of families adorn have the information until they have had the exposure and is already stressed, possibly sick, and frantically trying to navigate what they should or should not do, or until it is too late and they have exposed classmates and teachers. We need you to work with and require our school districts to communicate more clearly, we need your partnership to more widely publicize this information. (I recognize that other school districts are part of your jurisdiction as well and while many of these problems may be similar between districts I can only directly speak to North Kitsap).

Thank you for your time and commitment to our communities. I'd also request my email be shared among all the board members and to the mayors and be attached as public comment to your minutes.
