Our program serves as a hub for a network of local organizations and agencies that provide health and syringe exchange services to people who use injection drugs. We also offer education and resources needed in the community to prevent drug overdoses and save lives. By treating clients with respect and working to reduce stigma, we strive to create an environment where health, healing, and recovery are supported.

WHAT WE DO

Together with our syringe services partners, our program focused on these activities in 2022:

- Supporting community providers that collect and dispose of used syringes and provide clean syringes, to reduce the risk of disease and injury.
- Providing overdose education and naloxone to people who inject drugs and the community at large.
- Providing referrals to substance use disorder treatment, Hepatitis C and HIV testing and treatment, physical and behavioral health care, and social services.
- Facilitating the Peninsula Harm Reduction Network, which includes member organizations in Kitsap, Jefferson and Clallam counties.

Current network members represent the substance use disorder treatment centers, mental health providers, the State Department of Health and two syringe exchange programs: Peninsula Community Health Services and People's Harm Reduction Alliance.






REFERRALS
