They qualified for certification at the highest 5 star level for their efforts in protecting the environment and preventing pollution.

The Lawn Jockey helps educate his customers about naturopathic lawn and yard care. The business does not use weed & feed products, or fungicides. Instead they offer alternatives such as compost tea, Bt, iron sulfate and neem oil. Nick prepares his own organic compost tea using a blend of high quality materials. He obtains compost from facilities permitted through the Washington Department of Ecology.

Water conservation and preservation are important to the Lawn Jockey. He educates customers on water conservation that results in healthy lawns, and preserves water quality by not using toxic chemical fertilizers.

The Lawn Jockey is a member of the International Compost Tea Council. They have given talks at various industry related events including; master gardeners and composter garden clubs. Nick has also developed recipes of compost tea that provide a greater diversity of microorganisms necessary for healthy lawns and plants.

The Lawn Jockey also has a recycling program for solid waste. They recycle paper, cardboard, glass, aluminum and fluorescent lights. Future plans for waste reduction include looking into the use of biodiesel products.
