



# Public Health for the Peninsulas

Public Health is required by the state of Washington to promote important vaccines that are underutilized – Varicella, Pediatric Influenza, Rotavirus and HPV. **Senate Bill 5930 performance measures** outline



these and other requirements. Public Health will be knocking on your doors and ringing your phones now more than ever. Two of three performance measures have been selected as the foci of Region 2 Public Health to improve health outcomes.

## 5930 Goals challenge Public Health to improve outcomes

**Performance Measure 1**—Increase the uptake of new and under-used child and adolescent vaccines; specifically focusing improvement efforts and reporting on Varicella, Rotavirus, HPV and Pediatric Influenza.

**Performance Measure 2**—Improve the timely, complete identification and standard, effective investigation of notifiable conditions per WAC 246-101

- Action plans for Region 2 Public Health implementation include:
  - T**racking of notifiable condition reporting and investigation more quickly and efficiently.
  - E**ducation of health care providers and school staff about underutilized vaccines like Rotavirus and HPV.
  - C**hild Profile education and encouragement of expanded usage.
  - H**iring additional staff to enhance Public Health efforts toward meeting the goals of the 5930 performance measures.

## Child Profile It's not just for kids!



**Everyone** in the state of Washington can be registered through Child Profile. (The state is working on a name change!) Child Profile is the state immunization registry that is web-based, web accessible, and secure (i.e. it's
